**Free Visual Art Residencies for HCDE 2nd Grade Classrooms**  
**Funded by Usher and the Nancy Lackey Community Education Fund**  
**October, 2019 – May, 2020**

- The residencies are for all HCDE elementary schools that DO NOT currently have a visual art teacher.
- The residencies include 5 - fifty minute classes for each 2nd grade classroom.
- The residencies can be held on 5 consecutive days or on the same day of the week for 5 weeks. It is flexible to fit the school's schedule.
- Trained local teaching artists will lead the classes.
- A 30 minute planning meeting will need to be scheduled between the teaching artist and the school's 2nd grade team before the residency.
- Lesson plans are developed by the Southeast Center for Education in the Arts at UTC.
- All art supplies are included.

**Reading Portraits as Biographies (Beginning Workshop)**

Workshop Description:

Are you looking for ways to motivate and engage your students in the study of biographies and/or historical figures? Portraits are often considered merely a reflection of what a person looks like, when in actuality, they can be read as biographies that communicate significant information about a person's life while teaching students how to deeply observe, infer, and inquire. Learn how to help students unlock the symbolism in portraits, connect biographies with portraiture, use portraits as a point of inquiry for biographical research, and create portraits and writings to deepen and assess student understandings.

**Acting Right: Building a Cooperative, Social, and Kinesthetic Community (Beginning Workshop)**

Workshop Description:

Sean Layne has taken the foundational elements of acting such as concentration, cooperation, and collaboration and created a structured process, which can become the basis for effective classroom management every day. This engaging step-by-step approach empowers students to take ownership of and be responsible for their own behavior. In this workshop, teachers learn how to help students build the skills necessary to establish a sense of self-control, accountability, and teambuilding in their classroom. The workshop includes hands-on activities and demonstration classes with students.
