- And, we dug deeper to get direct feedback from artists and arts organizations by being part of the Chattanooga Music Census and leading the Arts and Economic Prosperity Study #6 which revealed a \$191 million economic impact of our local nonprofit arts and culture sector.

This annual report focuses on the ways that ArtsBuild impacts the lives of individuals in the arts community here in the Chattanooga region, and how those individuals make us a community of creators. We hope that you will have fun playing with these fabulous "paper people" and see how the work we do with individual artists is helping to bring more arts in more places for more people.










# Economic Impact of the Arts\*





### **Meet Arts Lover Andrew**


Andrew participated in the Holmberg Arts
