Artists Work Grants

The Artists Work Grants program provides funding to individual artists, artist studios, and non-profit arts organizations to produce artworks for public spaces in Chattanooga. Funding for the program was provided by the Lyndhurst Foundation, Benwood Foundation, and individual ArtsBuild donors. In the 2023-2024 round, a total of \$90,076 was awarded to twelve recipients.
